The mayor welcomed our community to the annual firework display at Felindre Playing fields on Sunday 5th November, which appeared to be successful. A big thanks to all involved.





PARKING PROBLEMS IN PENPRYSG

Thank you to all those that attended our public meeting. As you were aware we did invite multiple organizations to join us, to discuss your concerns, thank you to the PSCO who attended. We were just as frustrated as you were with the lack of engagement with other authorities. Since then, we have followed up with BCBC regarding the motion we put forward about the school street scheme that has been rolled out in Cardiff, with no response. The Mayor has also raised this point through various channels to try and get this exposed as much as we can, but yet we are still waiting a response from BCBC. We are continuing to pursuing all available options and the town council won't give up until your voices have been heard. Please keep an eye on our social media page and website for any updates.

Sadly, we missed out on the leveling up bid for our Penprysg Bridge for widening of the bridge. We have asked for feedback from those who submitted the application, so we can try and get a better understanding as to why we were refused, we are still trying to obtain that information. We are pursuing this with the relevant people, we will continue to campaign for the people of Pencoed until this matter is resolved.
